PURPLE PRAIRIE CLOVER

Purple Prairie Clover is a native, warm-season perennial legume found on many prairies with varying soil types. This forb makes a highly palatable and high in protein forage for livestock and wildlife. Aside from beautification, the Purple Prairie Clover can be planted for prairie restoration for its role in nitrogen fixation.
